Get a Lithuanian Student Card

The Lithuanian Student Card (LSP) is an important document proving that you are a student of the VDA and entitling you to use the Academy's facilities. The LSP also entitles you to access the country's public transport benefits and various student-only discounts throughout Lithuania and abroad.

Use the VDA electronic systems

You will have a VDA email address for the duration of your studies at the Academy, consisting of your name and the @stud.vda.lt ending.

You will receive all information related to your studies, timetable changes and important information for the VDA community at this email address. The use of this email address is mandatory.

Your VDA email address, which you will access at mail.google.com or www.gmail.com, will be created for you before the start of your studies.

The administrator will send your login details to your personal email account.

GOOGLE

With your academic email, you also get access to Google apps like Google Drive, Google Docs, Google Calendar and Google Forms. It's also the only email that connects you to the distance learning platforms Google Classroom, Google Meet or Google Video Meet or the VDA Moodle virtual learning environment.

MOODLE

VDA Moodle (moodle.vda.lt/moodle/login) is a virtual learning environment where students can access learning materials uploaded by lecturers. Please log in with your VDA email address and password.

Wi - Fi

In order to use the VDA wi-fi, you must get acquainted with the VDA procedure for the use of the resources of the computer system and fill in the application form at vda.lt/en/students/wi-fi/application.

WEB.LIEMISIS.LT

VDA AIS (web.liemisis.lt/vdais/stp_login) is the Academy's information system, where you can track your study results, see the number of credits you have accumulated and choose your elective subjects. The deadlines for registering for elective courses each semester are indicated in the course schedule.

Study!

Follow the timetable and keep to your study plan

You need to accumulate 30 credits per semester, so you need to follow your study plan in the VDA AIS and calculate whether you are missing credits. In terms of content, your study programme consists of general university subjects (at least 15 credits), study field subjects (at least 120 credits), practical training (at least 15 credits) and electives to further your specialisation knowledge and/or to study the subjects of another specialisation. Most study programmes have electives already in the second semester of the first year of studies. During the registration period for electives, please log in to your account in the VDA AIS system and select your electives according to the number of courses and amount of credits, foreseen in your study plan. All bachelor's degree programmes are 240 credits in length (except for the integrated studies in Architecture, which is 300 credits in length).

Exams and assessment

All semester assignments in the study programme are due during the semester. The examination session is held according to the schedule approved by the VDA Vice-Rector for Studies, comprised of the semester's creative projects' reviews and examinations, held at specified locations and at specified times. The coursework is analysed and evaluated by the departmental committee. In case of failure in attending the examinations or reviews, you must inform the programme leader or the head of the department of the reason for your absence by providing a document justifying the absence. In this case, you will be able to take the exam/review at another time during the semester, but no later than two weeks after the start of the new semester. The justified absences include illness or other health problems (with a doctor's certificate), important personal circumstances (e.g. illness or death of a close relative, becoming a victim of crime, loss of property), participation in activities of great significance for the Academy (e.g. representation at national, international or other events).

In the event of a failure in a subject in the humanities, social sciences or other sciences, a student may retake the examination once during the session in accordance with the examination schedule approved by the Dean. In-session retakes are not considered as failed grades.

Appeals

If you disagree with the grade(s) of the semester work(s) or exam(s), you have the right to submit a written request to the Dean of the Faculty for a review of the grade no later than 3 days after the results are published. As soon as the appeal board has assessed the written work, creative project or the oral examination, you will be provided with the board's decision.

Failed exams (academic debts)

If you have not retaken an exam or failed an exam for the second time, it will result as a failed grade in your academic system (an academic debt). The failed grade can be cleared within one year of studies by paying the course repetition fee. A student who has failed more than two exams and who has failed to retake at least one exam during the retake period without a justifiable reason, shall be deemed as a failing student and shall be removed from the Academy's student lists.

**Get a taste of
studying abroad**

During your studies at the VDA you can benefit from studying at any of the **200** VDA foreign partner art and design institutions or doing an internship abroad under the **Erasmus+** or **Nordplus** programme. Already in February you will get a chance to take part in the Erasmus+ competition for study exchanges abroad and choose to study from a list of 37 countries ranging from Iceland to Israel.

The Erasmus+ competition for internships abroad takes place in April.

Intellectual property

Works created in the course of the study process and/or in cooperation with the Academy's partners during projects or competitions are objects of intellectual property, which are subject to the VDA's intellectual property management regulations. For practical application regarding the VDA Intellectual Property Management Regulations, please contact the VDA Legal Department.

Non-property rights (authorship)

The author owns the personal non-property rights towards the results of an intellectual property activity. The Design Innovation Centre is responsible for the management of intellectual property rights and intellectual property objects created at the Academy, and can provide you more information regarding the management of intellectual property at the Academy.

Practice (internship)

It is a constituent part of the study programme, and is included in the study programme as a separate subject assessed by a grade. The Academy has two types of internships: creative internships and internships in enterprises, institutions, organisations and/or other institutions. The objectives, nature, duration, number of credits and assessment criteria of the internship shall be determined by the study programme and course description. Internships start after the completion of the first year.

Need to know

Scholarships

Earmarked (designated for a particular purpose)

Earmarked scholarships are awarded for a semester (5 months) or as a one-off.

Earmarked scholarship for a semester is awarded to: **the President of the Academy's Student Union; designated Student Union representatives at faculties; members of the VDA Chamber Choir; for participation in a mentoring programme with foreign students.**

An earmarked one-off scholarship is awarded for outstanding results of study and scientific activities, for significant achievements in artistic activities, for representation of the Academy in international projects, scientific conferences, competitions, exhibitions, social or sports activities. It may also be awarded in the event of the death of a family member, the birth of a child, prolonged illness, severe financial hardship and in other cases, provided that a motivated application and supporting documents are submitted.

A competition is held twice a semester for an earmarked scholarship to support research, study, creative activity and exhibition projects.

Incentive

Incentive scholarships are awarded to the best bachelor's, master's and post-graduate students, based on a comparison of the academic results of students in the same year of the same study programme, without regard to the nature of the funding for their studies.

Nominal

Students may be awarded nominal scholarships established by institutions, endowments or private individuals. Nominal scholarships are awarded to progressive students for exceptional achievement or merit.

Social

The social grant is open to all students who meet at least one of the following criteria:

- are from a disadvantaged family or living alone and entitled to or receiving social benefits;
- have an activity level of 45 % or less or a severe or moderate disability;
- until 25 years of age and have been placed under guardianship (custody), or their parents (or the only parent they had) are deceased.

Support for people with disabilities

Students with disabilities receive financial assistance for special needs and a targeted allowance to partially reimburse tuition fees for each semester. For more information, see vda.it/en/financial-questions/disability-aid.

State-funded place

If you are studying as a fee-paying student but have achieved excellent academic results, you may be transferred to a state-funded place of the same study programme, form of study and course, if you are entitled to state-funded studies during that period in accordance with the procedure laid down by the legislation of the Republic of Lithuania. If more than one student with the same grade point average applies for the place, the student with the highest grade point average in the previous semester shall be transferred. A state-funded student who is withdrawn or expelled from studies may be liable to reimburse the tuition fee to the State budget.

Change of the study programme

If you realise that your chosen study programme is not for you, you can apply to change your study programme. You can do this no earlier than after you have successfully completed the first semester of your first year and if there are places available in another programme.

Differences in courses, having arisen due to the change of the study programme or faculty, will not be considered as academic debts. The differences must be settled by concluding a student contract and paying the fee specified in the contract. A student, changing the study programme, retains the remaining part of the state funding, but if he/she transfers from a bachelor's degree programme to a full-time integrated programme in Architecture, the fifth year of studies shall be financed at his/her own cost.

Academic leave and termination of studies

If you are temporarily unable to continue your studies for personal reasons, sickness, pregnancy or baby care and can provide documentation to prove it (in the case of sickness and pregnancy or baby care), you will be granted academic leave. For pregnancy and infant care, leave is granted until the child reaches the age of 3, for personal reasons for a maximum of one year and only once during the study period.

A student on academic leave retains his/her social security. Only students who have been placed on academic leave for personal reasons are not exempted from the reimbursement of the tuition fee in the event of termination of studies. On return from academic leave, an application for continuation of studies must be submitted in the name of the Rector and delivered to the department or Dean's office at least 2 weeks before the start of the semester of studies. Studies are terminated in case:

- . at the student's request
- . for dishonesty in the course of studies or in the assessment of the results of studies (e.g., writing off, plagiarism, etc.).
- . having more than two academic debts (failed and not retaken 2 exams)
- . failure to return on time after academic leave
- . failure to pay tuition fees on time
- . for serious violations of the laws of the Republic of Lithuania or the Statute of the Academy
- . failure to defend a final project or thesis (negative evaluation of the final project or thesis).
